# ***CCC to post monthly “comp” reports***

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**ATLANTIC CITY**— The Casino Control Commission today started posting monthly reports of casino promotional allowances and expenses on its web site, providing key information to industry analysts, the media and the general public several months earlier than in the past.

“Under the new reporting schedule, these reports will be monthly and will be filed with us 20 days after the end of the month and posted on our web page shortly thereafter,” Commission Chair Linda M. Kassekert said.

Prior to the start of this year, casinos were required to file reports on promotional allowances and expenses on a quarterly basis. Those reports were filed 45 days after the end of each of the first three quarters and 90 days after the end of the fourth quarter.

“Providing this data in a timelier manner will increase transparency and allow analysts and the general public to better understand the gaming industry,” she said.

Promotional allowances and expenses, generally referred to as “comps”, are goods and services provided to patrons at no cost or a reduced price. They include items such as rooms, meals, travel, entertainment, cash and promotional slot machine credits.

The reports filed for January show casinos issued \$115.4 million in promotional allowances and expenses. That is down 3.2 percent from January of 2008.
